Historical Sketch: The documents found in this Collection all relate in some manner to the Town of Kingston and its residents. The Town of Kingston was established in 1726, when it separated from the Town of Plymouth. Kingston thrived in the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries as a shipbuilding and manufacturing town. Residents of Kingston often lived in the Town for many generations, often passing down (through generations) property and structures. Kingston residents were mainly (economically considered) middle-class, though there did exist residents who existed in the upper and lower (economic) class margins.

Scope and Content: This collection contains documents such as deeds, bills of sale, correspondence, land plans, receipts, tax bills and indentures of Kingston residents between the years of 1734 – 1903. The Collection came together as a result of miscellaneous documents, of undetermined provenance, needing to be housed and indexed. The only relationships that the documents in this Collection have are that they each relate to Kingston and its residents in some manner.
