Biographical sketch: Dr. William C. Gould was a long-time Kingston resident and one of the primary doctors in Kingston during the 1950s - 1970s. Gould, born in Worcester, attended Dartmouth College on a track scholarship and graduated from the University of Illinois in 1931. Gould continued onto medical school, graduating from Tufts University Medical School in 1935.

Following his graduation, Gould interned at the Worcester City Hospital from 1936 – 1939. He moved to Kingston in established a private practice in 1942. During World War II, from 1942 – 1945, Gould served in the U.S. Army. After his discharge, he returned to the area, studying orthopedics at Boston City College and resumed his practice in Kingston. Dr. Gould continued his practice in Kingston until 1982.

The medical examiner for Plymouth County, Gould was also a renowned orthopedic surgeon at Jordan Hospital in Plymouth.
